AeroCentury Corp., is engaged in the business of ownership, management, leasing and acquisition of aircraft. The primary focus is on used commercial turboprop aircraft equipment for lease to foreign and domestic regional air carriers.

On March 6, 2009, AeroCentury announced results for the fourth quarter of 2008 (ended December 31, 2008). Below are the Company's fourth quarter 2008 results versus Taglich Brothers' estimates and fourth quarter 2007 results:

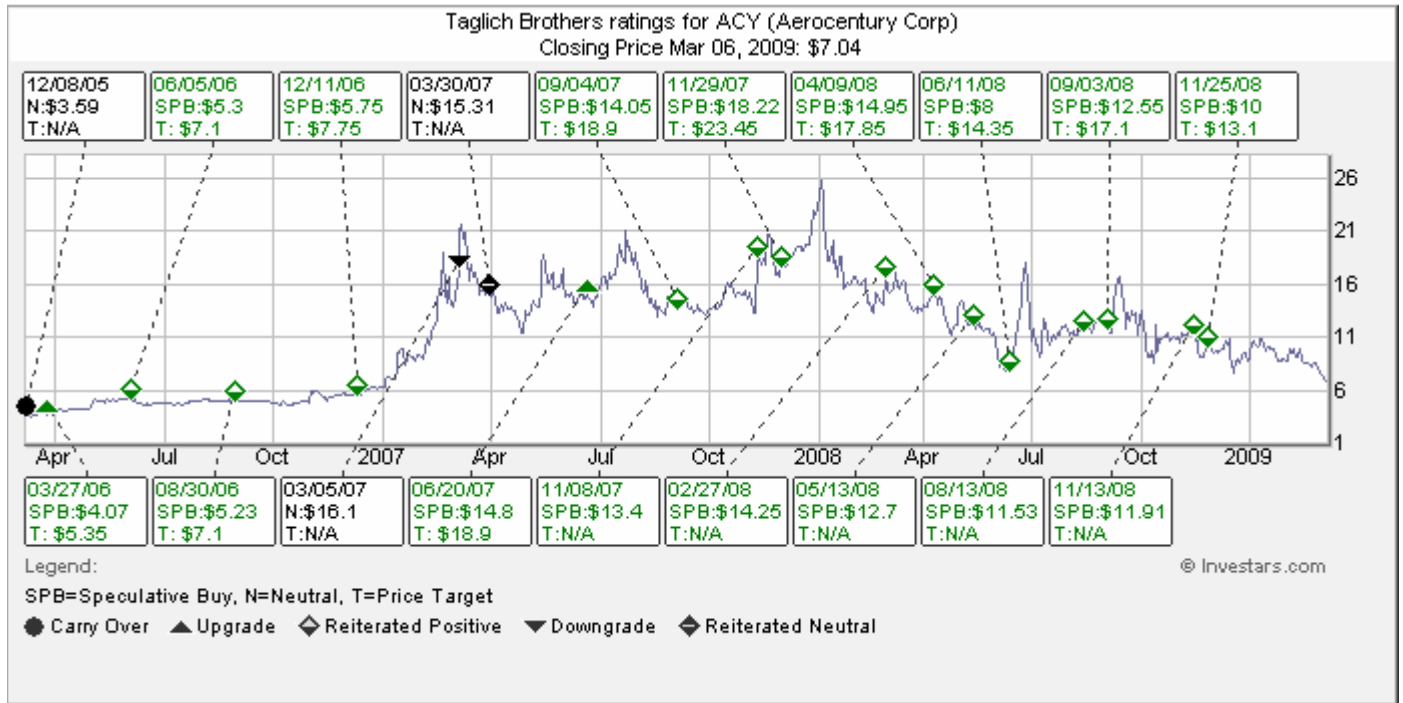

Estimate Analysis: Overall top line results were in line with our expectations. However, bottom line results fell short of our expectations, as the Company reported a loss of \$0.160 million or (\$0.10) per share for the fourth quarter of 2008 versus our expectations of net income of \$1.105 million or \$0.65 per share. The primary reason was that operating expenses exceeded our forecast by approximately \$1.668 million. Included in operating expenses was a provision for aircraft impairment of \$0.745 million. Also, maintenance costs and interest expense exceeded our forecast by approximately \$0.491 million and \$0.374 million, respectively.

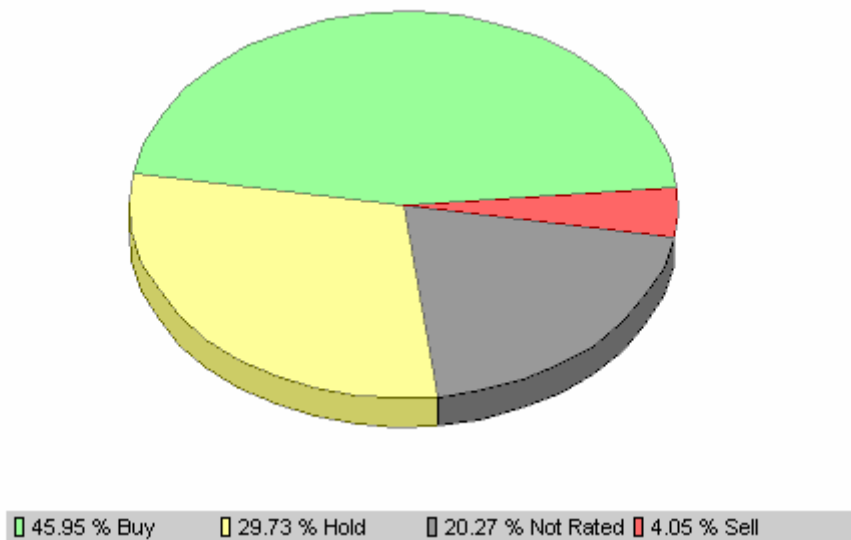
Rating: We are maintaining our Speculative Buy rating on shares of AeroCentury.

Meaning of Ratings

Buy

We believe the Company is undervalued relative to its market and peers. We believe its risk reward ratio strongly advocates purchase of the stock relative to other stocks in the marketplace. Remember, with all equities there is always downside risk.

Speculative Buy

We believe that the long run prospects of the Company are positive. We believe its risk reward ratio advocates purchase of the stock. We feel the investment risk is higher than our typical “buy” recommendation. In the short run, the stock may be subject to high volatility and continue to trade at a discount to its market.

Neutral

We will remain neutral pending certain developments.

Underperform

We believe that the Company may be fairly valued based on its current status. Upside potential is limited relative to investment risk.

Sell

We believe that the Company is significantly overvalued based on its current status. The future of the Company's operations may be questionable and there is an extreme level of investment risk relative to reward.

Some notable Risks within the Microcap Market

Stocks in the Microcap segment of the market have many risks that are not as prevalent in Large-cap, Blue Chips or even Small-cap stocks. Often it is these risks that cause Microcap stocks to trade at discounts to their peers. The most common of these risks is liquidity risk, which is typically caused by small trading floats and very low trading volume which can lead to large spreads and high volatility in stock price. In addition, Microcaps tend to have significant company specific risks that contribute to lower valuations.
